Calculation of Student GPA and the Basis for the Degree Award in modularised Nursing and Midwifery degree programmes.

The overall award to each graduate of an Honours Bachelors Degree Programme is calculated on the GPA (Grade Point Average).

The Degree GPA for full-time nursing and midwifery programmes is calculated on all modules, including elective modules, which the student completed and passed to satisfy the credit requirements of the penultimate and final stages of the programme.

These regulations are contained in the General Regulations on Modularisation, available on the UCD website <http://www.ucd.ie/registry/academicsecretariat/regs.htm> and were agreed by the UCD Nursing, Midwifery and Health Systems Programme Board.

Mode of Calculation of Final Honours classification for all modular students in the BSc(Nursing), BSc(Nursing) Integrated Children's and General and the BSc(Midwifery) programmes.

Programme	Weighting
BSc(Nursing) General and BSc (Nursing) Psychiatric	70% Final Stage 30% Penultimate Stage
BSc(Nursing) Integrated Children's and General	70% Final Stage 30% Penultimate Stage
BSc(Midwifery)	70% Final Stage 30% Penultimate Stage

GPA Award

Greater than or equal to 3.68	First Class Honours
From 3.08 to 3.67 inclusive	Second Class Honours Grade 1
From 2.48 to 3.07 inclusive	Second Class Honours Grade 2
From 2.00 to 2.47 inclusive	Pass
